Mitsubishi Nuclear Energy Systems Appoints Yoshinobu Shibata as President and CEO

Charlotte, NC, June 2, 2014 – Mitsubishi Nuclear Energy Systems, Inc. (MNES) has named Yoshinobu Shibata as President and Chief Executive Officer as part of the reorganization to focus the company's business on providing replacement components and services to U.S. nuclear power plants. Mr. Shibata holds a degree in economics from Keio University. He joined MHI upon graduation in 1984 and has held a range of management positions at Nuclear Energy Systems Headquarters. He will be based at the MNES Corporate Headquarters in Charlotte, NC.
